

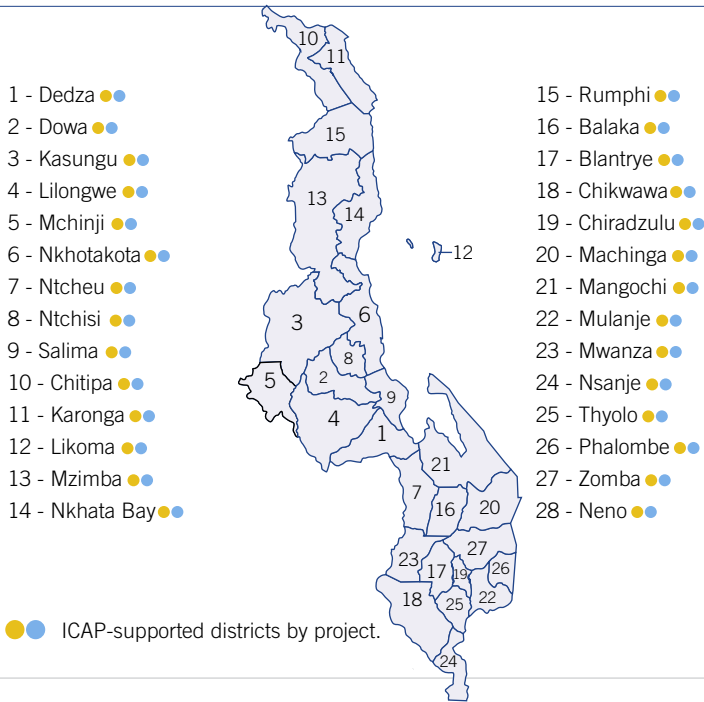

● Population-based HIV Impact Assessment Survey (PHIA)

ICAP is providing technical assistance and support to Malawi's MOH to conduct a population-based HIV impact assessment (PHIA) survey to assess HIV prevalence, incidence, and access to prevention, care, and treatment services. Survey findings will be used to assess the impact of Malawi's HIV response at a national level and to help guide and target future investment and programs. *(funded by PEPFAR through the CDC)*

● Nursing Education Partnership Initiative (NEPI)

ICAP is working with the MOH to build the capacity of health training institutions, enhance teaching and learning in the classroom and clinical settings, and use innovative curricula to reduce time to nurse accreditation. Through the NEPI project, ICAP provides tuition assistance, supports simulation labs, and offers online training in Option B+ for the prevention of mother-to-child transmission of HIV. ICAP is also supporting the development and implementation of higher degree programs to support the scale-up of the healthcare workforce.
