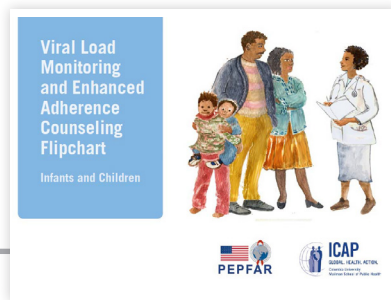


Viral Load Toolkit Flipchart

Printing and Assembling



Step 1

Download PDF of flipchart

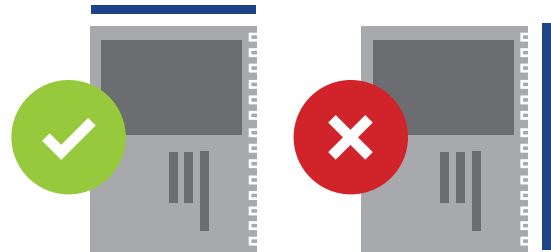
Use the powerpoint version to make edits and adapt to your context **but keep the blank pages in place.**



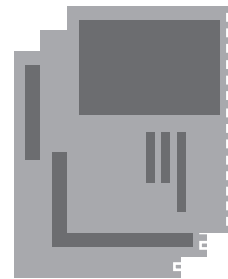
Step 2

Print document

Print double-sided with flip along the short edge.



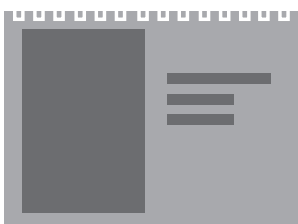
Keep all pages in order as printed.



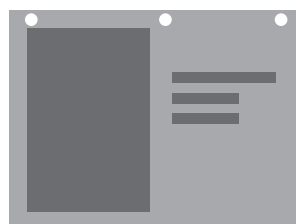
Step 3

Assemble

Make sure to keep all pages in order, bind or three-hole-punch across the long edge.



Binding, use a spiral binding and include a thick cardboard front and back cover so the flipchart can stand up on the table.



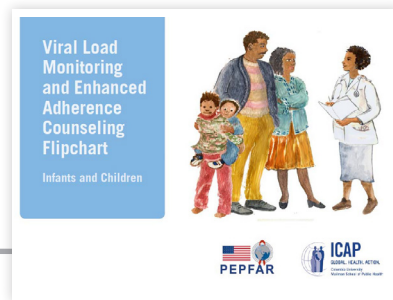
three-hole-punching, place pages into a binder with rigid covers so the flipchart can stand up on the table.



Final flipchart should have rigid covers and be able to stand up on the table, like a tent.

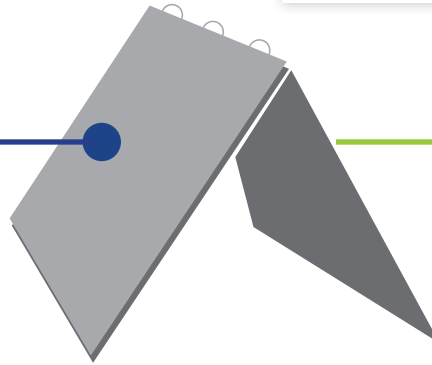

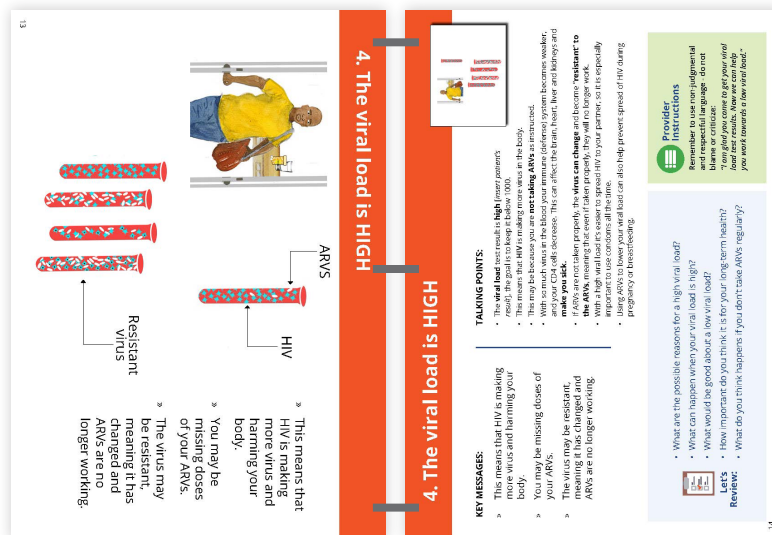

Setting Up / Using Two-Sided Flipchart

The Viral Load Toolkit Flipchart is designed to aid discussions between patients and providers. The patient sees illustrations and key points, while the clinician has more detailed information and instructions at hand to guide the encounter.

When assembled correctly, the flipchart can be placed between the patient and provider with one slide from each content pair facing each person.
